



## Abigail Marsh Preston

June 27, 1950 - July 11, 2024

Abigail Marsh Preston, aged 74, peacefully passed away in her sleep on July 11, 2024. She was born on June 27, 1950, in Grand Rapids, Minnesota, the second child of Dorthy and John Marsh. Abigail is survived by her older brother, August Marsh, two younger sisters, Patricia Sweatnam, and Kelly Marsh, and a brother, Andrew Marsh.

Abigail married John Preston, and from their union, she had one daughter, Jennifer Preston (now Taylor). Although their marriage ended after seven years, Abigail leaves behind her son-in-law Anthony (Guy) Taylor, three granddaughters: Adrianna Taylor (Bivens), Deja Preston, and Aiden Taylor, and two great-grandchildren, Julian and Lauren.

Abigail earned a degree in Mathematics from the Florida Institute of Technology and dedicated over 30 years of her career as a financial advisor at Merrill Lynch.

Later in life, Abigail found solace in her faith, accepting Christ as her Lord and Savior before retiring. Upon retirement, she moved to St. Augustine, Florida, where she quickly became an integral part of the First United Methodist Church community. Abigail took great pride in her role as the church historian and authored a comprehensive book documenting the history of the First United Methodist Church.

In 2021, Abigail was diagnosed with ALS, and despite the challenges, she bravely fought the illness for over three years.

A memorial service to celebrate Abigail's life will be held at 11:00 a.m. on

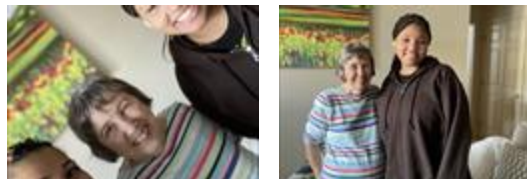

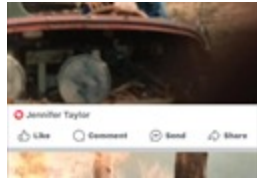
