Intelligent, vivacious and determined, she believed in achieving the impossible. She had an uncanny ability to strike up a conversation with anyone, anywhere.

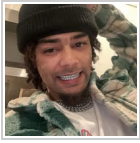
Our world is the all the more beautiful for Alex's creative spirit, as she never met a craft or artistic project she could not master.
