Alfred Joseph Deome, 76, born in Worcester, MA, presently residing in St Augustine, FL passed away to be with our Lord Jesus on Pearl Harbor Day, December 7th, 2020.

Al graduated from Sutton High School in Massachusetts before earning his bachelor's degree from Northeastern University. Al answered God's calling on his life and graduated from Tyndale Seminary with a master's degree in Biblical Counseling. Al became an ordained minister at Mountain View Baptist Church in Layton, Utah.

Al proudly served his country in the US Army. His military service included serving in the Vietnam War where he was MACV. His final rank was a Captain O4.

He is survived by his wife of 53 years, Saré; daughter Danielle Lucas; son, Christopher Deome; sister Nancy Russell, as well as four loving grandchildren.

Al has been cremated following organ donation. He will have a full military burial on December 30th at 1:00 PM at the Jacksonville National Cemetery with the family's pastor, Reverend Doctor Walter West officiating.
