



Dallas Robert Stratton

September 5, 1950 - February 17, 2024

Dallas Stratton, age 73, of St. Augustine, passed away on February 17, 2024, in Jacksonville, FL. Dallas was born on September 5, 1950, in Mount Holly, NJ the only child born to parents Dallas and Katherine Stratton. To his parents, he was "Dally". He grew up in New Jersey and traveled the US with his parents until moving to Florida at age 21. After moving he worked in the Charlotte County building department before moving to St. Augustine. For many years Dallas worked for the St. Johns County building department and the city of Palaka building department. He was a long-time member of the Ancient City Car Club. The most significant and life-changing event that happened during this time is that he met his sweetheart, Chattie Barnes, who moved from Indiana to marry him. Dallas married Chattie on June 22, 1979, who he affectionately called his "Babydoll". Dallas and Chattie started their married life in Port Charlotte, FL, and moved to St. Augustine, FL where they lived for 36 years. Dallas retired in 2008 and had been a resident of St. Augustine until 2023, before recently moving with family to Jacksonville. Dallas was a strong Christian and had a quick wit. He could be an introvert but when you knew him, he would do anything for you he could. Dallas was a classic car enthusiast, as he previously owned and restored many classics, his last being a 1952 MG midget. He used this car for many shows, and parades and was even in a local movie, "Flamingo Rising" in 2000. More than anything, Dallas was a loving husband, Uncle, Godfather, and friend to many and he will be deeply missed.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by several Aunts and Uncles. He is survived by his wife of 44 years, Chattie Stratton; a Goddaughter, Anna Reagan and her husband Christopher, a sister In-law, Andrea and her husband Billy of SC, a niece In-law Robin and her 3 daughters, Chloe, Cassidy, and Martha-Clare, of SC.

A Memorial Service will be held at 2:00 p.m. on Saturday, March 2, 2024, at St. Johns Family Funeral Home in St. Augustine. In honor of Dallas, the family requests those attending to wear something red, which was Dallas' favorite color.

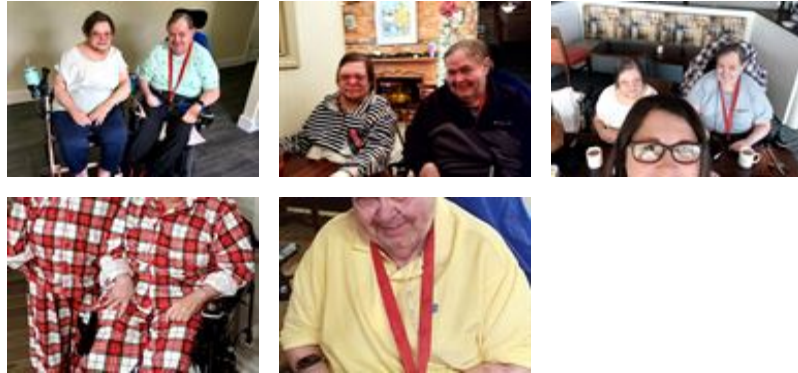
