



## Dennis Joseph McConville

January 8, 1951 - September 19, 2021

Dennis Joseph McConville, 70, passed away September 19, 2021, at his home in Palm Coast, Florida. He was born on January 8, 1951, in Brooklyn, New York to Joseph McConville and Marcela (Winkler) McConville. Dennis grew up and attended local schools in Brooklyn before serving his country as a member of the United States Army. Dennis proudly served during the Viet Nam era of 1971-1973.

Upon his separation of duty, he returned to New York where he went to work for a private contractor at the Naval Yard in Brooklyn from 1974-1979. Dennis then went to work for the New York Department of Corrections from where he retired as a captain following his 15 years of service. He worked at correction facilities at Rikers Island, Brooklyn, and The Bronx. Dennis moved to Palm Coast, Florida following his retirement in 2002 where he was a member of VFW 8696, the Elks Lodge, American Legion, and the DAV.

Dennis is survived by his sons; Brian McConville, currently serving in the US Army in Korea, Keith McConville, and Sean McConville both of Palm Coast, FL, and sister; Patricia Boyle of New York.

A Memorial Service will be held Thursday September 23, 2021, beginning at 5:00 PM EST at St Johns Family Funeral Home. Military Honors will be held at 5:30 PM followed by a time of visiting with the family concluding at 7:00 PM.

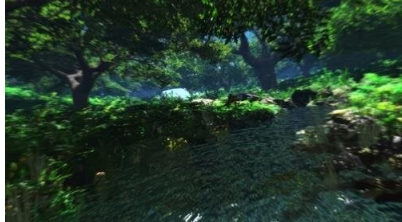

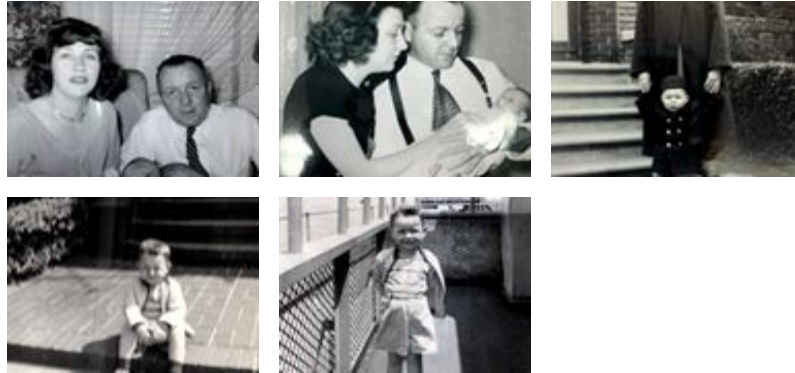
