She possessed a timeliness elegance. Her speech was gracious and kind to everyone she came in contact with.

She was truly "clothed with strength and dignity," Growing up in the depression made it unthinkable for her to waste anything. She would wash and reuse a piece of aluminum foil or freeze a tiny portion of food rather than throw it away. She lost everything she owned in this life, not once, but twice. Hurricane Camille in 1969 and Hurricane Katrina in 2005.

She devoted her life to taking care of her family and friends. She made soup if you were sick and cake if it was your birthday. She had a great sense of humor. She cooked for "the crowd" until she 90 years old! My sisters finally had to make her stop. She could encourage and entertain anyone over a New Orleans cup of coffee with chicory. My sisters and I learned "Southern Hospitality" and so much more from her. Her life was simple but marked by a selfless generosity that seems to be fading away with her generation.
