Eric I love you. Our inside jokes and all our words we shared will always stay with me.

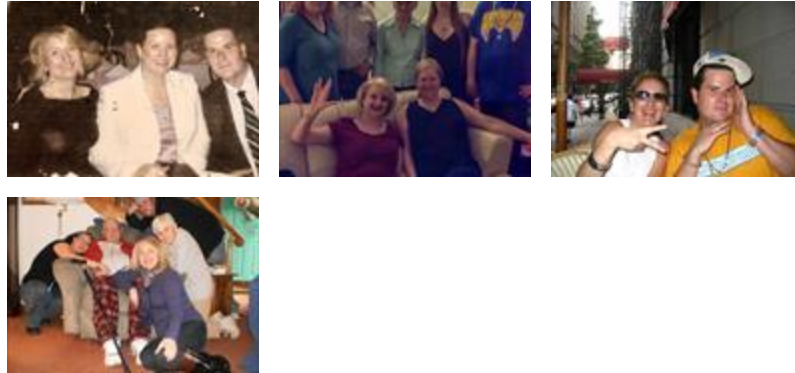
I hope you knew how much you are loved.
