Ernest B. Smith, 87 of St. Augustine, passed away on March 1, 2020 at Samantha Wilson Care Center. He was born in Lynn, Massachusetts on December 8, 1932, where he grew up.

Ernest joined the U. S. Air Force in 1951, never realizing he would become a world traveler and live in many countries with his wife and three children. His first assignment was in Wyoming and then to Paris, France where he met his wife, Maria Ettinger (nickname Inge) and married in 1955. From Paris the couple traveled to Kansas, Spain, Massachusetts, Turkey, Spain, Belgium, California, Germany, Spain, and Washington D.C. His last assignment was in Germany, where he retired. Their children, Clark, Jenny and Greg had the opportunity to travel to many European countries and experience their culture which they greatly benefitted from. He retired after 26 years in the U.S. Air Force as a Senior Master Sergeant.

Ernest then became a Department of the Army civilian employee where he worked in Long Island, New York. He then went to Schwetzingen, Germany and worked as a U.S. Army Postal Operations Officer. There were many TDYs where he travelled to Israel, Egypt and Saudi Arabia. He and his wife also took advantage of living in Europe and travelled to almost every country and enjoyed it very much.

Ernest retired after 46 years of total service and he and his wife settled in St.

Augustine, Florida in 1998, where they enjoyed many visits from children and grandchildren over the years.

Ernest was always dedicated to his work and his family. He was great attribute to society and a man to be very proud of.
