Eunice Stanley Davis passed away peacefully on August 23, 2024, at the age of 91. Born on July 23, 1933, in London, England, Eunice's life was a tapestry of resilience and love.

Eunice was born of a strong generation, having survived the blitz of London during World War II. This experience made her grateful for everything she had and she appreciated every day of her long life. She attended the London School of Fashion and Design but chose to dedicate her life to homemaking and motherhood, where she excelled and took immense pride.

In 1954, Eunice met and fell in love with Russell Davis, a country boy from the Blue Ridge Mountains of Virginia serving in the United States Air Force. Their love story spanned 56 years of marriage and many moves around the world. Eunice embraced her life as a homemaker and mother. She was known as the best wild game cook in the Blue Ridge Mountains and she loved to design and sew clothing for her family members. She also enjoyed travelling often to see family and friends.

After Russell's passing in 2011, Eunice relocated to St. Augustine, Florida, to be closer to her daughter Sharon. Despite settling down, she remained an avid traveller, frequently visiting family across the USA and in England.

Eunice is survived by her children: Gary Davis (Shellie) and Sharon Langford (Reid), who held her hand as she transitioned from this life; grandchildren: Bryan Davis (Micala), Katie Minella (Angelo) and Christopher Langford (Sally); 6 great grandchildren; brothers: Harold Stanley and Anthony (Christine) Stanley of United Kingdom as well as numerous nieces and nephews.

In addition to Russell, Eunice was preceded in death by her parents, William and Violet Stanley; sister, Rita Brooker and brother, Bill Stanley.

There will be no formal funeral ceremony, instead, her ashes will be spread at her favorite places, alongside of her beloved Russell at Mt. Tabor Church in Agricola VA and family members in the UK.

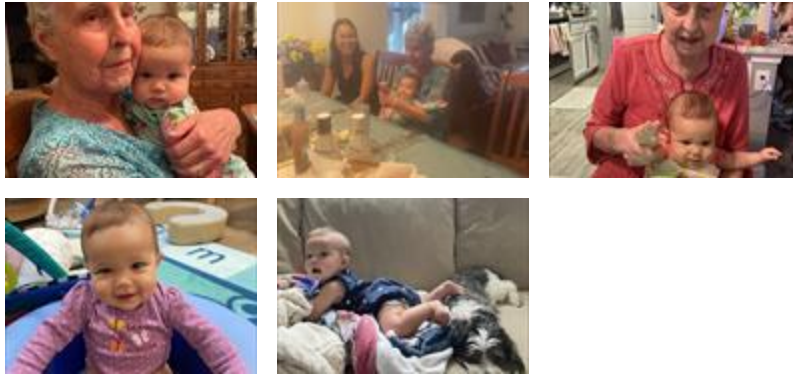
