George Vincent Sabato, age 75, of St. Augustine, passed away on August 27, 2019 at his home with his family by his side. Born and raised in Washington D.C. and joined the U.S. Navy at age 17, serving his country for 4 years. In 1972 he met his beautiful wife and the two married in Ft. Myers on January 12, 1974. George started his career as a volunteer firefighter for Prince George County, before being hired as a paid firefighter where he was employed for 7 years. After getting his name on the federal register he was hired as a fire fighter at naval training center in Orlando. His career took the family to NAS, Key West, Fl and Cecil Field, Jacksonville. George made St. Johns County his home where he has resided for the past 35 years. During his career with The Dept of Defense he did a 4 year overseas tour in Guantanamo Bay, Cuba along with his family. He followed that with a one year solo tour and retired from the Fire Dept in Guantanamo in February 1996. George was also a certified dive instructor in Maryland, was a member of search and rescue and he also gave private lessons. During his retirement he continued to enjoy diving and snorkeling, fishing and of course boating, including living aboard a 44 foot Defever, fulfilling a dream. Later he went on to become an avid Harley Davidson rider and was a Mason 32 degree and a certified coastguard captain.

He is survived by his wife, Lorraine "Lori" Sabato of St. Augustine; son, George Edward Sabato (Cindy) of Warrenton, VA; daughters, Stacey Marks (Kevin) of St. Augustine, Samantha Beckett (Thomas) of Austin, TX;

grandsons, Jonathan and Hayden Beckett of Austin, TX, August Marks of St. Augustine; granddaughter, Piper Marks of St. Augustine; sister, Connie Bushnell (David) of Frederick, MD and step brothers, Stanley and Joel Goldberg of Olney, MD.
