



George Rainie Wages

August 16, 1948 - November 30, 2025

George “Rainie” Wages, age 77, passed away at his home in St. Augustine, Florida, on November 30, 2025. Born on August 16, 1948, in Fort Worth, Texas, he was the beloved son of the late George and Lucille Wages.

Rainie graduated from St. Augustine High School, Class of 1966. He attended St. Johns River Community College for two years, where he was often more drawn to catching waves at the beach than to being in the classroom. In January of 1968, “Punkin” enlisted in the United States Navy, proudly serving his country until his honorable discharge in 1973. Following his service, he continued his education at the University of Southwestern Louisiana.

Rainie was a man of many passions. In his younger years, he loved surfing and spending time on the water, and throughout his life he enjoyed fishing, tackling DIY projects, playing tennis, and supporting SAHS Yellow Jackets football. For over 20 years, Rainie was a devoted member of Anastasia Church’s Island Campus, where he found fellowship, purpose, and community.

Rainie is survived by his wife of 55 years, Ronda; his children, K. Shane Boen (Mike), Erin Repp (Michael), Carrie Klauss (Erik), Kellin Heron (Marshall), and Ashley Cooper (Kane); and his grandchildren Brandon Boen, Jacob Trautsch, Madison, Aiden, Harper and Teagan Repp, Ariel Cagle (Sean), Lauren Klauss,

Connor Griffin, Arleigh, William and Austen Heron, and Kadence and Ashton Cooper. He also leaves behind his great-grandchildren Camden Cagle and Stella Dudley and Charlotte Repp; his sisters Sissy (Lucille) Messer and Sandy Wages; and many extended family members and friends who loved him dearly.

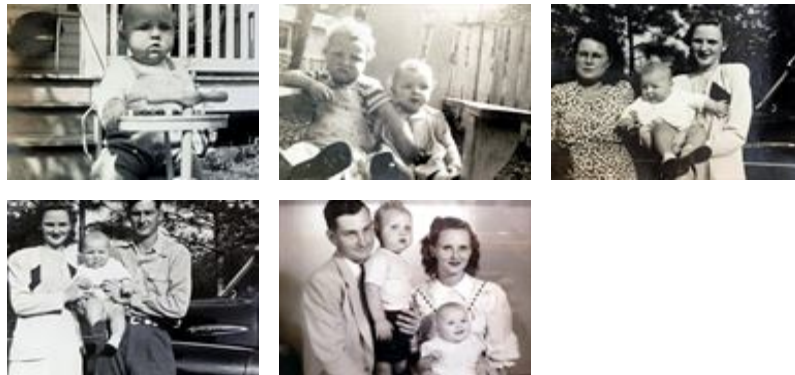
