H. Carl Hoefler, Jr., age 81, of the Coquina Crossing Community in Elkton, died on December 21, 2010 at Flagler Hospital. Born in Syracuse, and raised in Tully, New York, he was a longtime resident of St. Louis, Missouri, retiring to St. Augustine in 1988. Carl graduated from Hamilton College in Clinton, New York and served his country in the U.S. Army during the Korean War. He worked for Oneida Ltd., Ozalid and for many years as a Product Manager for Monsanto Corporation. He enjoyed participating in local community organizations and government, and served as Mayor of Manchester, Missouri. After retiring to St. Augustine he served on the Columbus Commission for which he minted the quincentennial commemorative medallion, and later on the Presidio De San Augustn Commission, serving for several years as its Chair. He also was instrumental in the construction of the historical replica of the Cubo Line defense and Santo Domingo Redoubt. He is survived by his loving wife of 57 years, Ann Hoefler of Elkton; daughter, Cynthia Sadlek, and husband Lance, of Davenport, Iowa; son, H. Carl Hoefler III, and wife Genoveva Mart of Barcelona, Spain; brother, David Hoefler of El Mirage, Arizona; and grandchildren, Kassandra Sadlek, Julia Mart Hoefler, and Ian Mart Hoefler. A memorial service will be held at 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday, December 28, 2010 at the Coquina Crossing Clubhouse. Graveside services with military honors will be held at 2:00 p.m. on Wednesday, December 29, at

Jacksonville National Cemetery.
