James Emil Massad, 86, St. Augustine, died October 9, 2021 at Flagler Hospital. He was born in Watertown, NY, the son of the late Emil and Blanche Massad. Jim was a veteran of the U.S. Army. He taught chemistry in Syracuse, NY, and retired from Henninger High School. Throughout his career and after retirement, he tended bar for Bellevue Country Club, slinging drinks and one-liners. He was an avid golfer, and enjoyed volunteering at World Golf Hall of Fame, giving tours. Jim loved to travel with his wife and daughter and together they visited every continent except Antarctica. He was an active member of San Sebastian Catholic Church where he served as a lector and was a member of the Knights of Columbus. His love, kindness, wit, generosity and sense of humor will be missed by all who were lucky enough to have known him.

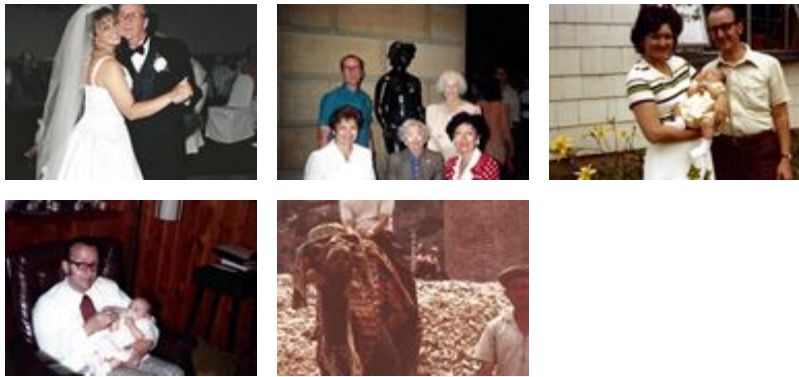
Jim, you lived a good life.
