



James Michael "Jimmy" Silvia

James Michael "Jimmy" Silvia, age 66, passed away unexpectedly on February 11, 2020 at Advent Health in Palm Coast. Jimmy was a native of St. Augustine and lived here for most of his life. He graduated from St. Augustine High School with the Class of 1971. He went on to study guitar with Lyster Bass in Atlanta, Georgia, and graduated from Dekalb College. Later in Athens, Georgia, he studied guitar with John Sutherland, a renowned educator, who was a student of Andrés Segovia, Christopher Parkening and other fine guitarists.

Jimmy was a guitar teacher and performer, most recently teaching many styles of guitar, including classical, flamenco, flat and fingerpicking, bluegrass, jazz, rock and Christian music at The Music Studio for six years. During his life, he performed in a variety of bands and also taught banjo and ukulele. He was a member of Anastasia Baptist Church where he had played in contemporary and traditional services since 2002.

Jimmy was preceded in death by his parents, James Silvia and Marion Grace Hagan of St. Augustine. He is survived by many friends and students in the community, and his church family, and staffs of his favorite restaurants.

A celebration of Jimmy's life will be held at a later date at Anastasia Baptist Church.

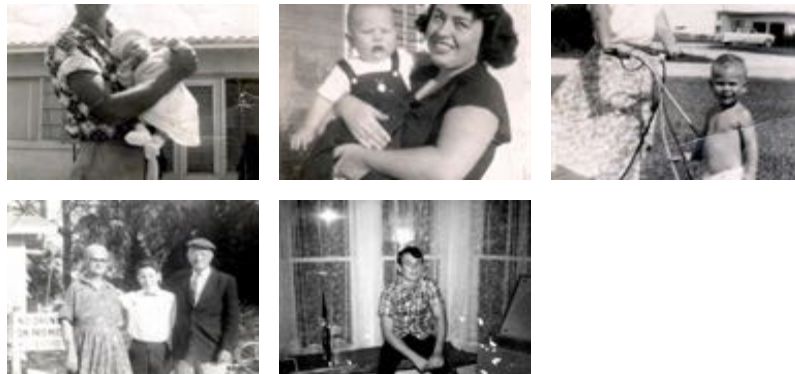
