Jaret Joshua Coleman, 21, passed away in St. Augustine, Florida on Monday, January 6, 2020. Born on March 13, 1998 in Pembroke Pines, Florida, he was the son of Jack and Melissa Coleman. He resided in Pembroke Pines until he was 7, and then moved with his family to St. Johns, Florida in July 2005. In Orlando, Florida, he briefly held a welding internship in the summer of 2015 with his grandfather, Paul Smith, at The Welder Guy, LLC. In St. Johns, he held several odd jobs throughout the years. 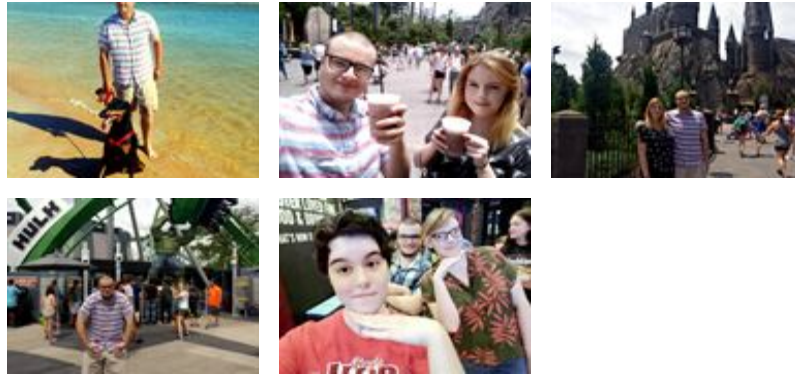
