Jason Scott Mullins, Sr., age 50, of St. Augustine, was taken from us too soon on February 2, 2023. Jason was born on January 30, 1973 to Nancy Love-Martin in Roanoke, VA and was a 1991 graduate of Northside High School. He went on to attend Virginia Tech, graduating in 1995 with a Bachelor Degree in Graphic Arts. After graduating from Va Tech, Jason joined the staff of Ferrum College as their Graphic Designer and later served a designer for software developer Intergraph Corporation in Alabama. During this time Jason trained to become a Licensed General Contractor and eventually transitioned into a successful career in real estate construction and development. In 2011 he moved his family to the historic Lincolnville area of St. Augustine to enjoy his love for the ocean and water sports. Jason fell in love with St. Augustine, its history, architecture and the community. He volunteered for a number of non-profit organizations, including serving on the Board of Directors for the St. Francis House, and was active with the Historical Society. He was a very active member of the Cathedral Parish and worked tirelessly with the annual Cathedral Festival and hosted Oyster Roast for the Cathedral Parish School when his children were students there. He was well known in the St. Augustine community as a man with a huge heart who was always willing to help. In the aftermath of the frequent downtown floods, he put his contractor skills to work helping others. His wit and smile were infectious. More than anything he treasured his family. He was a loving father, son, brother and friend to many and he will be deeply missed.

Jason is survived by his daughter - Madeleine Mullins and his son, Jason S. Mullins, Jr. of St. Augustine; his mother and stepfather, Nancy Love Martin and William "AL" Martin of Kill Devil Hills, NC; his sister, Joleigh; nephew, Eric; and niece, Maigan.
