Larry E. Lee, age 72, of St. Augustine, went to be with his loving Savior on July 28, 2013 at the St. Augustine Health and Rehab Center. Born and raised in Knoxville, Tennessee, Larry married and moved to Florida with his young family. He worked for Woolworths for 17 years, managing the downtown St. Augustine store during the 1960's, when Martin Luther King came to visit. Upon relocating to North Carolina, Larry and his brother, Norman, owned and operated the Hunts Department Store (now called The General Mast Store) in Boone, NC. In the 1980's, he moved back to Florida, and spent his retirement years managing his own booth at the St. Augustine Flea Market, selling collectables and antiques. Larry was a talented artist, who enjoyed restoring old furniture, and who also loved fishing, flowers and plants, and country music. He was a member of Anastasia Baptist Church. He was preceded in death by his mother, Billie Lee, and father, Clarence Lee; former wife, Sandra Lee, and a brother, Norman Lee. He is survived by his loving and caring companion, Nancy Vaughn of St. Augustine; sons, David Lee of Vero Beach, FL and Jeff Lee of Lenoir, NC; a daughter, Cynthia Scott, and her husband, Rex, of St. Augustine; sisters, Phyllis Roberts, and her husband, Gerald, of Chattanooga, TN and Marlene Taylor, and her husband, Robert of Gainesville, FL; brother, Dennis Lee, near Chattanooga, TN; half sisters, Karen Flores, Kay Wellons and Karla Hodges, all of Knoxville, TN; six grandchildren and two
