He continued to hone his craft over his career, through experience and continued education.

Lloyd was awarded KY Photographer of the Year in 1994. And was a published photographer.

He carried a positive outlook on life, and his creative spirit allowed him to share that perspective with the world through his art.

“ I knew Lloyd as a very young man when he first got out of High School. He was hired by my boss Stan Ballenger who new Lloyds father. I had the honor of training him in Portrait Photography for Bryn Alan Studios where I was the Head of Photography for our Outside of Jacksonville, Florida High Schools we photographed from Pensacola, Florida to Charleston South Carolina which we traveled to do Seniors in High School. Lloyd was one of the most talented & intelligent young photographers I ever trained and became extremely good at doing this at a very young age. I had been trained as a Professional Photographer also at a very young age as my father was a WWII Navy Photographer and taught me the profession where I joined the Navy as a Photographer during the Vietnam War in the late 1960's. I remember Lloyd told me he was joining the Marines and wanted to become a Marine Photographer I was shocked but understood he wanted adventure in his life. I have followed Lloyd's career now for decades and really admired all his accomplishments he attained as I also went on and started my own Photo business I had for many decades also. I was very shocked of learning of his passing and grieve that we lost such a Great Photographer, Husband & Dad at such a Younger Age than myself. I will grieve his passing and always miss hearing about him in the future as well as missing his friendship these many years. 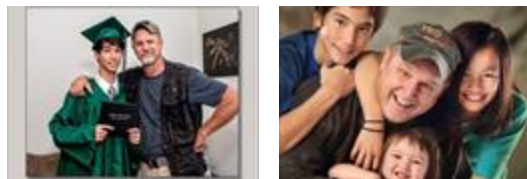
