Marjorie June Goodall, age 87, of Palm Coast, passed away peacefully on December 10, 2020 at her residence with family at her side. Born and raised in Alum Creek, West Virginia, she was a 1951 graduate of Washington District High School. She joined the US Navy right out of high school and served during the Korean War. It was thought in earlier days that Marjorie and Bob were destined to be married, and on August 16, 1998 those foretelling's became reality. Marjorie and Bob enjoyed their retirement traveling, and spending time with their children, grandchildren and great grandchildren. Marjorie was a longtime member of Crescent Beach Baptist Church.

*All my love and hugs to you Miss Marjorie – so glad Dad shared his “Pretty Lady” with us! You’re the very Best!*

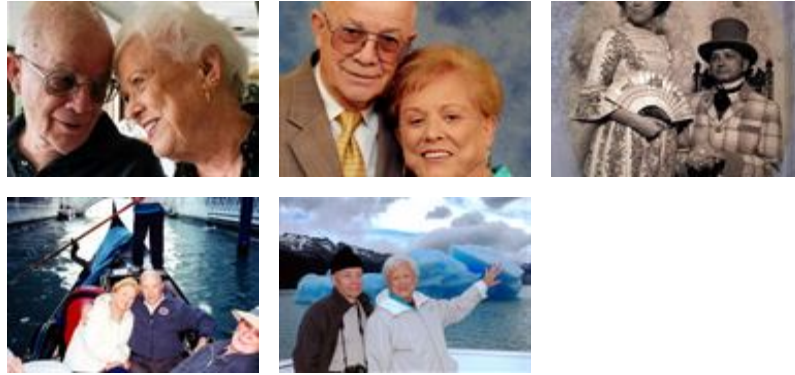
