Mark Joseph Adams was born on October 25, 1982, in Miami, Florida, to his devoted parents, Mark and Martha Adams. From an early age, it was clear that Mark possessed a brilliant mind, a kind heart, and a deep love of learning.

He attended the School for Advanced Studies (SAS) in Kendall, one of Florida's and the nation's most prestigious public high schools, known for allowing students to take college courses while still in high school. Mark embraced this opportunity fully, ultimately completing more than 310 college credit hours—a testament to his intellectual curiosity and wide-ranging interests. He earned his degree from Florida International University in Liberal Studies, focusing on subjects including science, mathematics, engineering, English, history, philosophy, art, and computer science. Mark's education reflected his desire to be a true Renaissance man.

Creative and forward-thinking, Mark once designed a shark logo for FIU that was selected as the winner of a university design competition. Though the logo was ultimately not adopted due to copyright considerations, FIU honored his work and recognized his contribution with gratitude and respect.

Mark's talents led him to work at NASA, where he contributed his skills and knowledge at several of the agency's major locations: Houston, Huntsville, and Cape Canaveral. His time with NASA reflected both his scientific acumen and his passion for exploration and innovation.

Mark also worked with Dr. Gustavo Roig, who is a professor in the biophysics program at Florida International University (FIU) for 4 years.

After his time in Miami, Mark moved to Palm Coast, where he found peace in simple pleasures—especially parking by the beach and reflecting while listening to the word of God. He had a deep and personal relationship with his faith, often taking time to pray and meditate near the ocean.

Mark was a passionate educator who dedicated his life to teaching and inspiring young minds. He taught at St. Brendan High School, Saint James, various Miami public schools, and later at the Jail, Belle Terre Elementary, and Mill Creek Academy. His teaching style combined academic rigor with creativity—incorporating art, history, and practical life skills into his lessons. He taught students from kindergarten through sixth grade how to type, problem-solve, and think outside the box.

Mark also volunteered his time to chaperone educational trips to Washington, D.C., with Florida International University. He guided underprivileged children through the Smithsonian museums, the National Gallery of Art, and even the U.S. House of Representatives, enriching their understanding of science, history, and civic life.

A man of many passions, Mark loved painting, drawing, reading extensively—especially about science and innovation—and playing video games. He was an avid SEGA fan and even won a national SEGA Dreamcast Tournament, generously sharing a portion of his prize with his grandfather. (<https://www.ign>.

Mark cherished time with his family and especially enjoyed bonding with his beloved dog Samuel, named after the prophet. He had a profound ability to connect with people, offering love, empathy, and unwavering support to those in need. Every child he taught held a special place in his heart.

Despite severe allergies, Mark had a deep affection for animals and an unshakable spirit of kindness and compassion. He was a truly special soul—creative, brilliant, generous, and deeply loved by all who knew him.

Mark is survived by his loving parents, Mark and Martha Adams, and his beloved brother, Michael Adams.

A visitation will be held in Mark's honor at St. Johns Family Funeral Home on Wednesday, May 28, 2025, from 5-7 PM. The graveside service will take place the following day, Thursday, May 29, 2025, at 10:00 AM, at Craig Memorial Park Cemetery.

It was in those quiet, personal moments that I realized I had gained far more than a coworker—I had gained a true friend. Someone whose presence enriched my days, and whose absence now leaves a space that cannot easily be filled.

May we honor his memory by carrying forward those same values, and by remembering Mark not just for what he did, but for who he was.

Rest in peace, Mark. You will be deeply missed, and forever remembered.

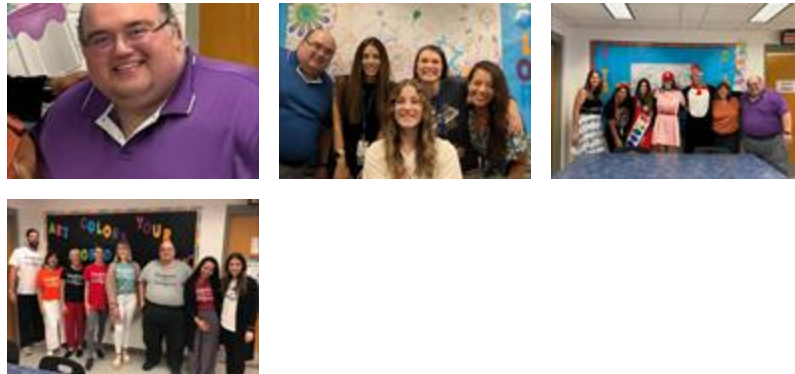
