Nathan Clark Halbrook, a beloved son, father, brother, and friend, passed away unexpectedly on December 15, 2025, at the age of 50. Born on August 23, 1975, in Saint Cloud, Minnesota, Nate's life was a tapestry woven through various states, including time spent in New York, New Jersey, Colorado, Illinois and Florida. He was educated at Vermont Academy in Saxtons River, Vermont, where he enjoyed his passion for hockey, playing for the school's team.
