Robert Leon “Bob” Bell, 79, Crescent City, Florida, passed away at the Bailey Family Center for Caring in St Augustine, FL on April 4, 2019. He was born in Pecos, TX and lived in Texas for much of his youth until moving to Dos Palos, California where he would graduate from high School. Several years after completing high school, Bob joined the civil service and served as a pipefitter at the Hunters Point Naval Shipyard in San Francisco. He then moved on to Puget Sound Naval Station in Bremerton, Washington where he continued his career until retiring in 1993.

Bob met Judith Marshall in 1992 in Port Orchard, WA and they married in 1993. Following Bob’s retirement he and Judy spent the next five years on the road in their RV.
