Robert "Bruce" Connaway, age 66, of St. Augustine, FL and Lyndonville, VT passed away on January 25, 2016 in St. Augustine. Born in Waco, Texas, Bruce grew up in an Airforce family and lived in several different states and countries but always considered Texas as home. Bruce met his wife, Nancy (Ingalls) while serving in the Army Medical Service Corps in Colorado Springs. They married in 1974. Bruce went on to graduate from Baylor Law School and practice law in Texas for more than 20 years. Nancy and Bruce made their home in Arlington, TX until 2012, then retired to spend the summer months in Lyndonville and the remainder of the year in Florida. Bruce made friends wherever he went. He had a special gift of humor and never met a stranger. He was an avid sailor and historian; he loved music and travel. Bruce will be deeply missed by all.
