Ronnie Leverne McKnight, 57, of Spring Hill, passed away on Sunday, July 21, 2024.

Born in Lake City, SC, to the late Adam and Elizabeth McKnight, Ronnie was the youngest of eleven siblings. He is survived by one brother and three sisters.

Ronnie's early passion for news reporting, writing, and theater led him to pursue studies at Francis Marion University in Mass Communications and Theatre before transferring and graduating from the University of South Carolina. always his family, who will remember him for his unwavering love and dedication.

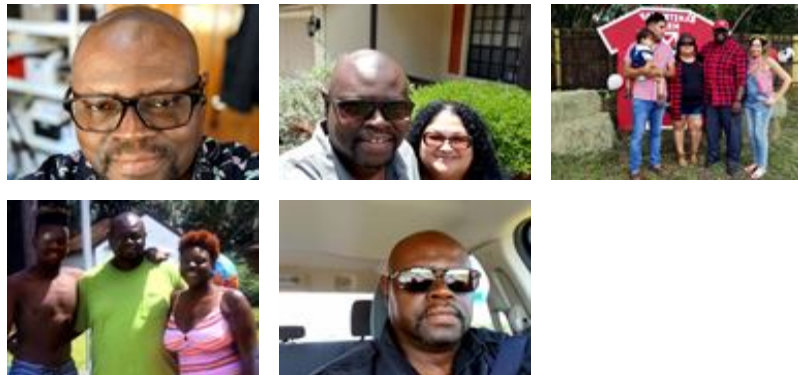
