Stuart Marquis Stout (Stu), age 65, of St. Augustine, passed away peacefully on Monday, Sept 27, at his residence. Born in Cleveland, Ohio, Stu was a longtime resident of Odenton, Maryland, before moving to St. Augustine in December of 1991. He was a graduate of Washington Bible College in Washington, D.C. He served in the U.S. Army's Security Agency for four years and continued serving his country working for the Dept. of Defense as a Cryptologist with the National Security Agency at Fort Meade, Maryland. After retiring from the N.S.A., he moved to St. Augustine and worked as a computer systems operator for the First Coast Technical Center and most recently for the St. Johns County School Board. He was a member of Anastasia Baptist Church where he served as a Deacon and Teacher for many years. Stu was bold and tireless in his efforts to communicate the Gospel message.
