



## Vincent Anthony LoPresti Jr.

Vincent Anthony LoPresti Jr., 78, beloved husband, father, grandfather, brother, uncle, brother-in-law, son-in-law and friend passed away unexpectedly on January 10, 2023 in St. Augustine, FL at Flagler Hospital after a yearlong illness. By his side surrounding him with love, was his wife, Angie and their 4 daughters.

Vincent was born in Birmingham, AL on April 20, 1944, to Vincent Anthony LoPresti and Catherine Louise McAnally LoPresti. He graduated from Woodlawn High School in 1964. He became a connoisseur of wine and attended the International Wine Guild in Denver, CO and earned a level 2 degree Wine Sommelier.
