Warren K. Anderson passed away peacefully on April 25, 2018, at the Bailey Family Center for Caring with his wife, Sheryl, and his beloved pet Muppy by his side. The son of George and Lillian Anderson, he grew up in Kingsport, TN, graduated from TMI and the University of Tennessee (Phi Gamma Delta). He also served in the U. S. Army during the Korean Conflict and the Army Reserves until 1960. Recognized as an expert in the transportation industry, he served as operations manager for Sea-Land Corporation in several U.S. ports simultaneously when containerization was just in its infancy. While working for Crowley Maritime in the early 1980's, he designed and helped to produce a plastic wheel-seal designed to prevent tire theft in the industry, naming it "TattleCap". Also, he was a consultant with the World Bank in the early 1980's making the operations run more efficiently in the major ports of India, Pakistan, and South Korea. He was instrumental in the formative years of Sy-Klone International in Jacksonville. During his leisure time, he loved to play golf and became an avid Scuba Diver, and was co-owner of a Dive Travel Agency. In the mid-1990's, he was certified as Assistant Fire Chief in South Ponte Vedra, Station 9. He also served on the South Ponte Vedra Turtle Patrol. Warren is survived by his wife and "beach buddy" of 31 years, Sheryl C. Anderson. He is also survived by his (former) second wife, Carol Anderson, and numerous family members including a son, Warren K. Anderson, Jr.
